<b>Pneumococcal Conj.</b> Pneumococcal 20-valent conjugate vaccine			✓

<sup>3</sup>Regardless of trimester, influenza vaccine should be offered with every pregnancy during the flu season.

<sup>4</sup>Regardless of age and previous vaccination status, Tdap should be offered with every pregnancy.

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
